Outreach Grants - Education and Research Meetings	August 1 and March 1	The Outreach Grant Program provides funding for workshops, symposia, and meetings organized by members.	Up to \$3,000
Anatomy Training Program	March 1	The Anatomy Training Program (co-sponsored by AAA & The Anatomical Society) is intended to provide vocational training to those involved in teaching anatomy but who have not had much exposure to either human anatomy or clinical experience.	Tuition for each participant, plus expenses for the one-week Residential School in England
Innovations Program	June 15 - deadline for letters of intent, September 2 - full proposals due	The Innovations Program provides funding to support new scientific, educational, and professional development programs and services developed by members and/or Committees. All initiatives must directly connect to the organization's strategic plan goals.	Up to \$50,000
Henry Gray Distinguished Educator Award	August 15	AAA's highest education medal is for human anatomy education in the anatomical sciences as broadly defined—including gross anatomy, embryology, histology, and neuroanatomy—at the medical/dental, graduate, or undergraduate level of teaching.	\$4,000 honorarium and up to \$1,750 in travel support to attend the Annual Meeting
Henry Gray Scientific Achievement Award	August 15	AAA's highest scientific honor recognizes unique and meritorious contributions to and achievements in anatomical sciences by a distinguished member. This award is supported by Lippincott Williams & Wilkins.	\$1,500 honorarium and up to \$1,750 in travel support to attend the Annual Meeting
A.J. Ladman Exemplary Service Award	August 15	Presented periodically to a member distinguished in the field of anatomical sciences who has provided exceptional service to the Society and/or mentorship in the discipline. The award is supported by Wiley.	\$1,000 honorarium and up to \$1,750 in travel support to attend the Annual Meeting
Young Investigator Awards	August 15	Recognizes investigators in the early stages of their careers who have made important contributions to biomedical science through their research in cell/molecular biology, developmental biology, comparative neuroanatomy, or the morphological sciences.	\$1,000 honorarium and up to \$1,500 in travel support to attend the Annual Meeting

Short-term Visiting Scholarships	February 1, June 1 and October 1	The Short-term Visiting Scholarship Program is intended to provide travel support for members to facilitate visiting a laboratory or participating in a course outside their home institution.	Up to \$1,000 in travel support
Postdoctoral Fellowship Program	October 1	Postdoctoral Fellowships are intended to provide salary support to members who are postdoctoral trainees working in any aspect of biology relevant to the anatomical sciences.	\$20,000 in salary support
Basmajian Award	October 15	The Basmajian Award recognizes health science faculty who are in the formative stages of their career (within 10 years of their highest earned degree at time of nomination), teach human or veterinary gross anatomy, can document excellence in their contribution to the teaching of gross anatomy, and have outstanding accomplishments in biomedical research or scholarship in education.	\$1,000 honorarium and up to \$1,500 in travel support to attend the Annual Meeting
Fellows Grant Award Program	October 15	The Fellows Grant Award Program (FGAP) is intended to support research proposals submitted to national or international funding agencies that were scored, and generally well received, but did not receive funding. The program will provide short-term funding for either established or young investigators who have submitted a peer reviewed grant application to a major funding sponsor within the last 15 months and received a full review but were not funded. All investigators must be AAA members in good standing for the past 2 years.	Up to three grants will be awarded annually in amounts not to exceed \$25,000. Each grant will be awarded for a period of one year, without opportunity for a no-cost extension.
Education Research Scholarship	October 15	The Education Research Scholarship is intended to support a member who is a graduate student in a mentored project, or a postdoctoral fellow or junior faculty member (rank no higher than assistant professor) who wishes to develop a project that shows promise as a model for improving the quality of teaching and learning in anatomical education.	\$5,000 and up to \$1,000 in travel support to attend the Annual Meeting
Student and Young Faculty Travel Awards	November	Guaranteed travel awards provided to all student and postdoc members who submit an abstract and present their work at the Annual Meeting - held in conjunction with Experimental Biology. In addition, abstracts are judged by a committee to determine finalists to compete in one of the Platform or Poster Presentation Awards.	\$250 -new members \$350 - renewing members Up to five awards of \$500 awarded to young faculty members on a competitive basis
Young Anatomist's Publication Award	December 1	The Keith & Marion Moore Young Anatomists' Publication Award was created to recognize the best publication by a young anatomist in one of the society's journals-- Anatomical Sciences Education, Developmental Dynamics, or The Anatomical Record.	\$1,000 honorarium and up to \$500 in travel support to attend the Annual Meeting
