

## Criteria and Eligibility

Candidates are expected to have been a member of AAA for 4 or more years. Exceptions based on family leave or other circumstances should be addressed in the nomination.

Nomination materials include the candidate's CV and a brief (up to one-page) summary of highlights documenting evidence of excellence in science, contributions to the anatomical sciences, and service to AAA. Self-nominations are permitted.

Examples of ***excellence in science*** include but are not limited to:

- Evidence of impactful publications
- Extramural funding and invited service on review panels (e.g., NIH, NSF)
- Local, national, and international awards and recognitions
- Invited talks and conference presentations
- Editorial contributions (e.g., EIC, AE)
- Patents or other creative works

Examples of ***contributions to the anatomical sciences*** include but are not limited to:

- Curriculum development or educational program leadership
- Teaching awards or other recognition of impact
- Develop or manage resources for research or education
- Mentorship (e.g., postdoctoral, graduate, professional, undergraduate students)
- Public outreach or policy impact
- Invited participation on educational review panels

Examples of ***service to AAA*** include but are not limited to:

- AAA Board membership or slated for election
- Contributions to committees, task forces, or award review panels
- Contribute to AAA symposia, workshops, or webcasts
- Record of publications, reviews, or editorial service for AAA journals
- Attending and bringing trainees to national and regional meetings

Election as an AAA Fellow is an honor, and all Fellows are expected to meet the commonly held standards of professional ethics and scientific integrity."
