Carefully consider what *you* want in a graduate program. One person's dealbreaker may be another 's minor inconvenience or desirable quality.




Do Your Research

Find out whatever you can about the graduate program, especially how to apply!




Check out what the people associated with the program are working on too!




Talk to EVERYONE
